How do you become a student intern?


It's easy! **Eligible students are those that are in their second year or higher in their medical imaging education.** You must complete an application, personal profile and submit an essay. These forms are included with this invitation.

In addition, you must ask your Program Director to write you a letter of reference. The letter must be in a sealed/signed envelope and included with your application. Please also include a copy of your PSRT membership card.

All application materials should be received by February 10, 2020. Applications received post-marked past this date will not be considered. The application, copy of your current PSRT membership card, personal profile, essay, and letter of reference all are requirements for consideration and must all be sent in one mailing to:

The paper should be well researched and a minimum of 3 bona fide sources should be included.

The papers will be judged using the enclosed rubric.

Your paper should: **Tell us how participation in the PSRT Student Intern Program supports your academic and/or career goals, and describe any specific skills, knowledge or experience you have that would make you well-suited to be a student intern.**
